Your option choices allow you to dive deeper into subjects you are already good at, helping you to further develop your skills and confidence.

Choosing subjects that you are genuinely interested in will likely lead to better engagement, effort, and performance in those subjects.

6. Builds Key Skills for the Future

Subjects like mathematics, science, English, and technology develop critical thinking, problem-solving, and communication skills essential for a wide variety of careers.

Year 10 options help prepare you for NCEA Level 1, where subject-specific knowledge and skills are tested through both internal and external assessments.

8.Keeps Your Options Open

By making wise choices now, you avoid limiting yourself in the future. For example, selecting a science subject could allow you to pursue health sciences or engineering later on.

9. Boosts Motivation

Taking subjects that interest and challenge you can make school more enjoyable and motivate you to work hard and achieve your best.

10. Aligns with Long-Term Goals

Whether you want to go to university, start a trade, or enter the workforce, your subject choices now play a role in setting you up for success.

Next Steps

When selecting your Year 10 options, consider both your current strengths and your long-term goals. Talk to your teachers, parents, and careers advisors to make informed decisions that will help you excel not just in Year 10 but all the way through to Year 13 and beyond.

Note: All akonga are enrolled in 5 core areas as compulsory subjects. These are English, Mathematics, Science, Social Science and Religious Education. Option selection is in addition to these cores.



Process for making your 2025 choices

Year 10 Option Choices Process

Follow these steps to make informed Year 10 option choices using the **Schoolbridge App**. Consult with your parents or caregivers, and ensure your choices align with your interests and future goals.

1. Review Option Blurbs

 Read the summaries of each subject. This helps you understand what each course offers and how it fits your future plans.

2. Discuss with Parents/Caregivers

 Talk with your family about your options. Their input can help align your choices with your long-term goals.

3. Seek Teacher/Advisor Guidance

 Ask your teachers or the careers advisor for advice if you need help deciding on subjects based on your strengths and interests.

4. Log into Schoolbridge

• Use your credentials to log into the Schoolbridge App and navigate to the "Option Choices" section.

5. Choose 2 Options for Terms 1 & 2

 Select 2 subjects for the first half of 2025. Choose subjects that build a solid foundation for your senior years.

6. Choose 2 Options for Terms 3 & 4

• Pick 2 subjects for the second half of the year. Consider subjects that will broaden your learning and keep future options open.

7. Review Choices with Parents

 Double-check your selections with your parents/caregivers to ensure they align with your goals and strengths.

8. Submit via Schoolbridge

Submit your choices through Schoolbridge by the deadline.

9. Follow Up with Teachers

 Confirm your choices with teachers to make sure you're on the right track for Year 10 and beyond.

10. Stay Engaged

• Keep communication open and be proactive with your learning. These choices prepare you for future NCEA subjects and career pathways.

- Interior Designer Plan and design interior spaces that are both beautiful and functional.



Ākonga will work on portfolio-based projects, requiring effective time management and independent planning to achieve their best possible outcomes. This subject not only fosters creativity and technical skill but also encourages ākonga to consider sustainable practices in their design processes. Year 10 Fashion textiles and design prepares students for NCEA level 1 Fashion textiles and Design in Year 11.
